## **Class Placement for September 2021**

At this time of the year, parents begin thinking about their child's placement for next year. Please know that our staff members work together to thoughtfully place students in classes based on the number of teachers assigned to our school by the District Office.

When determining your child's placement, a variety of factors are considered; for example: the number of students in each class, a balance of boys and girls, academic and social strengths and needs, learning styles, friendships and special interests. We use our professional judgement, existing data, and discussion as we create classes, keeping in mind the considerations listed above. Staff who are part of the process include the principal, vice-principal, current classroom teacher(s), next year's classroom teacher(s) at that particular grade level, and support staff including counsellor, learning support teacher, and ELL teachers. It is the responsibility of the school staff to arrange classes so that each student has a positive learning environment and teachers have a manageable teaching assignment. Much thought and effort goes into the placement of each child.

As principal, I will only consider written requests for class placements that describe the academic, social and or physical needs of the child. These must be submitted by **Thursday**, **June 3rd**. As always, classes will be finalized at the end of the first week in September. 






# EARTH DAY April 22, 2021

# National Child & Youth Mental Health Day






#### Who can Join

#### **Camp Sessions**

At Royal Soccer Club, we're much more than just a soccer camp. We have 2 different sessions you can register for. Campers will build confidence and creativity as we foster an inclusive, engaging and active summer camp experience. We recognize that many of our campers attend for multiple weeks of camp, so we accommodate this by introducing weekly themes and vary the activities & skill exercises. We aim to provide the best experience for your child.

#### Morning Sessions 9 am - 12 noon

Morning sessions are geared towards campers who just want a half day program and prefer the soccer focus. Programming consists of learning and playing soccer daily which includes a daily warm up, individual skill development, fun team games, soccer scrimmages and mini-Royal Cups. Campers are grouped by age, size (& ability where possible) in groups sizes are about 10 campers to 1 staff (these ratios are subject to change) to change).

#### Full Day Sessions 9 am - 4 pm

Our full days sessions are the most popular sessions families register for. These sessions combine the morning sessions (as outlined above) with a fun afternoon session (that may or may not include a leisure swim depending upon the option you select during registration. All campers will play a variety of camp games in the afternoon. Campers who choose the swim option will also get a chance to swim at the nearby pool each afternoon (some locations may not swim every dv). The afternoon swim portion is fully supervised by our camp staff and professional pool facility lifeguards. There are limited spaces for the 'swim' option to ensure supervision ratios are safe and pool regulations met. At some locations, campers aged 5 to 7 may not be able to choose the Supervision or contact us at 1-800-427-0536. There might not be any soccer played in the afternoon sessions.
