Safety Before Convenience

As our school population has increased this year with new students and staff, our parking lots continue to be a safety concern. Parents are asked to **park** and **walk** their children from Arrow Street (in front of the East Building) or from the Dover Street parking lot.

Our parking lot off Nelson is designated for Burnaby School District staff members, Welcome Centre families and the District Learning Resource Centre **only** and there is not enough space for parents to park or drop off when bringing children to school. It is also very unsafe for students and parents to be walking through the parking lot as staff members are arriving and trying to park.

Cell Phones/School Phones

It has become very common for students to have personal cell phones at school. Our position is that these cell phones are intended for, and should only be used for, safety. With that in mind, we ask for your support in reinforcing the following guidelines:

- Cell phones (or any expensive items such as iPods) are here at your child's own risk in terms of loss or breakage.
- Cell phones should remain in students' backpacks during the day, including recess and lunch.
- All cell phones are to be turned off during the school day.

If students need to use the telephone during the day to make important phone calls to parents, they may ask their classroom teacher for a phone pass that allows them to use the office telephone. Students who do not follow these guidelines may have their cell phones confiscated until the end of the school day when a parent can come to the office to pick it up.
