- 4. Principal's Report (Bruce Cornell):
 - School Org Update
 - 1046 students

 - Basketball

- Chair's Report (Tanja Scekic Ivkovic):
- Hot Lunch was on Th, Nov 14. Divisions 3, 5, 6 helped with the delivery. Thank you to all the volunteers: Ajlin, Arezoo, Brad, Cassandra, Gigi, Paddy, Roz Sima, Sunita, Yulia, Tanja. We collected the juice boxes, and Paddy took them to Return It and got \$30.20 to be deposited to PAC Account.
- Fundraisers:
 - Mabel's Labels update (a cheque to \$103.25 was issued and mailed on Oct 23 (Tanja deposited), \$79.94 was issued Dec 18. it hasn't arrived yet)
 - Christmas Purdy's Campaign (launched on Nov 3, closed Nov 27th; delivery was on Dec 4, Pickup on Dec 5& 6) Cheque \$1,209.60 arrived and was deposited (Tanja)Thank you to Paddy, who helped with sorting, and Debby who helped with pick up on Day 1!
 - Appreciation Treats and Coffee for the staff on Dec 20th. Tanja bought and arranged. Emre brought some additional treats as a gift. Cost \$149.85, Tanja to be reimbursed. Bruce and Nancy helped with the coffee. Thank you!
 - PAC Facebook Account Gigi worked on this during the Christmas break.
 - Deposited cheques and cash for PAC, Grade 7 and Quebec Trip fundraisers.
 - PAC received \$128 donation through SCO (School Cash Online) Thank you!
 - Scholastic Dollars Tanja placed an order for the library (\$166.25)
 - Maple Cookies for the Carnival \$200 budgeted, Mariah has approached SaveOnFoods about donation to cover the difference. We also need more boxes (100) as the number of students increased since last school year.

Treasurer's Report (Florence Dompas - absent):

- Monthly Update: There has been no change on income. School cash online have been used up.
- Tanja explained the need to increase the budget for maple cookie from \$200 to \$250 due to inflation was motioned by Debby and seconded by Cassandra. Budget amendment approved.



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DPAC Report (Mariah Battiston):

The last DPAC meeting was held on January 15th. There was a presentation presented by School Board representatives for the Treasurer's portfolio and finance related issues for PAC. They discussed Community Gaming Grants, fundraising funds and reporting, etc.

They discussed what we can and can not fund. For example: if we were to do a technology fundraiser it could not be for computers, laptops, ipads etc. as there is a security component associated with these, however we could fundraise for a new PA system.

There is no offsite fundraising for PAC initiatives with alcohol with some exceptions decided by the school board. Also if we want to purchase something bigger for the school, we should go through the school board as they have access to bulk discounts and we save the GST/PST.

As for the General meeting portion of the evening, things are still in flux but they did vote in 2 more executives for the 2 positions that will become vacant January 31st as 2 members are stepping down.

CPF (Canadian Parents for French) Report (Mill and Emre):

- Budgeted for Arts performance, French books, field trips.
- Confirmed with our Principal, Feb 9th is marked down for FI students to enjoy the free film show at SilverCity Metrotown. Students will walk to Metrotown. Parent volunteers may be required depends on the class teacher's arrangement.
- 2- various grants available from CPF Burnaby. Details have been communicated with school admin to escalate to French Immersion teachers.
- Literacy Grant French book subscription, CPF Burnaby will purchase three subscriptions to the Max Book Club up to \$250 for each Burnaby District French Immersion School, application due Jan 31, 2024
- Resource Grant CPF Burnaby will consider requests up to \$250 per school from Burnaby District French Immersion Schools for new teacher resources, proposal required on or before Jan 31, 2024
- Fete des Arts CPF Burnaby is offering to pay for 50% of the performance fee for a French cultural performance, up to \$500. Application due Jan 31, 2024

Grade 7 Graduation/Leaving Ceremony Committee (Vanessa):

So far Apples Sales, Neufeld Frozen goods in the fall. The plan is to do another Neufeld sale in the spring, as well as some hot lunches and freezes sales. There are some freezies left from last year's Graduation Committee that they will be selling. Started contacting vendors and getting quotes.
