1. Welcome & Land Acknowledgement

- 2. October 21, 2024 General Meeting Mintes were approved and are available on the School Website. Motioned by Rosalind, Seconded by Mill.
- 3. Principal's Report (Bruce Cornell)
  - 1. Scholastic Book Fair
    - a. Thank you for all your hard work on the Scholastic Bookfair. It was well attended, and the staff and I appreciate all your hard work on another successful bookfair
  - 2. School Org Update
    - a. 1069 students with new ones starting next week
  - 3. Staffing
    - a. Mr. Wong will be our new VP. He has come by and met with the office staff and will be by again later this week.
    - b. He is coming to us in an acting role but is a great fit for our school
  - 4. Volleyball
    - a. Thank you to, Ms Davis, Ms. Selig, Ms Dare and Ms Morris for coaching. The students practiced and played hard.
    - b. Both the rec teams and competitive teams did well and represented the school well
  - 5. Parking Lots
    - a. A reminder for the community that the parking lots are for staff only. They are not drop off or pick up locations. We understand the lack of

parking in the neighborhood and have had the Dover Street lot repainted to allow some pick up. \*We encourage parents to park in a designated spot and not block the roadway through the lot

b. We ask parents not to use the lot between the Welcome Centre and DLRC building. With the construction and moving of the DLRC on the parking lot side, we have a large number of district vehicles using the space.

#### 6. West Kitchen

- a. Need to work on getting items from PAC to the East Kitchen for storage
- b. Kitchen will be available for use for things but not storage.
- c. I am working with the district to create a Community cupboard to help families who need support with food

## 5. President's Report (Tanja Š. I.)

Tanja repeated about PAC and Gr. 7 monthly newsletters and weekly emails (every Wednesday) that would include reminders about events and activities.

- Fall term fundraisers (September December)
  - Fun Lunch: last date for this term is December 13 (hosted by Gr. 7)
  - Mabel's Labels is an ongoing fundraiser, with delivery to home.: current balance is \$26.96, cheque is issued after reaching \$50
  - Created by Kids Art the art was delivered November 28 &29. We had 150 orders, and got \$1,867 back that will go towards "Classroom Supplies and Resources'
  - Photo Fundraiser the photos were delivered to the school and are ready for pick up. The proceeds \$1125 were transferred to PAC Account.
  - Neufeld Farms Frozen Goods were delivered on Dec 3. Total proceeds of \$907 (out of that amount \$124 was transferred to BFLP as their share, based on the BFLP parents who supported the fundraiser. By opening our fundraiser to our community members we were able to reach the minimum amount required for free delivery.
  - Purdy's Christmas Campaign items were delivered and picked up, except for one box of items. We should be receiving it tomorrow. Cheque to \$ 729.10 will be sent to PAC in the coming weeks.
- Scholastic Book Fair was a great success with over \$14000 in total sales. We will get back 50% after the tax in Scholastic Dollars. The worksheet was submitted, and we will have our balance information in a couple of weeks. We are so happy that the students, families, and teachers enjoyed the fair. Big thanks to all the volunteers, the school staff for their support, and a special thank you to our amazing Teacher Librarian, Mr. Irwin.
- Health & Safety inc. Grounds Improvements and traffic safety:



- PAC received a response from the School District regarding the traffic safety concerns and requests, mentioning "The City has limited ability to implement traffic calming measures on the other streets in the area as these are major arteries." On the City of Burnaby website, there is the Recommendation Summary for Elementary School Traffic and Safety Study Elementary School Traffic and Safety Study | City of Burnaby which identifies traffic calming measures, including speed reader board, as a planned improvement for our school. PAC will send a reply to the School District and a request to the City for clarification.
- First Aid Attendants question: Rosalind asked Bruce about the protocol when the students get hurt during recess and lunch break play time. Bruce clarified that there are no First Aid Attendants designated to helping the students. The protocol is that if anyone is hurt, the student is to come to the office (West and East) to get help such as ice or band aid or if parents need to be called, etc. If a student cannot walk to the office, others should look for a supervisor on the field to get help. During the recess, the students are supervised by the teachers, and during the lunch play time, by the noon supervisors. Supervisors wear vests for easier identification on the fields.
- Recess Sport Equipment: Starter kits were delivered, prepared (marked with room numbers, balls were inflated) and distributed to all the divisions. Thank you to all the volunteers who helped. Primary divisions got a soccer ball, a playground ball, 3 hula hoops, 5 skipping ropes and 1 long skipping rope. Intermediate divisions received a soccer ball, a basketball, a volleyball, 5 skipping ropes and a long skipping rope. The items were approved by the school, the orders were placed by Ms. Venos, the Head Teacher.
- Classroom Supplies & Resources Art Fundraiser proceeds of \$1,867 were topped up by the PAC, and a cheque to \$5500 was issued to the school (\$4500 for 45 divisions and \$1050 for ELL, LSS and Music Teachers)


