6. Chair's Report (Tanja Scekic Ivkovic)

Thank you, PAC Executive Members, Grade 7 Committee and Fun Lunch Committee Chair: I would like to start by thanking our PAC Executive Members - Roz, our Vice-chair, Patrick, our Treasurer, Debby & Ajlin, our Secretaries, and Mill, our CPF Representative, for their hard work this year, being on the executive team, attending the meetings, working together towards the goals we set last September. Also, our Fun Lunch Committee Chair, Cassandra, who happened to be the Grade 7 Committee Chair too, for running the hot lunch for both PAC and Gr. 7 and for smooth cooperation throughout.

Thank you, Marlborough School staff: Thank you to our Principal Mr. Cornell, our Vice Principals Ms. Giacomazza and Mr. Wong, our Head Teacher Ms. Venos, our school secretary Ms. Custodio, and our Librarian Mr. Irwin for helping us this year.

Thank you to all the volunteers - parents, grandparents, other family members and past students. None of this could have happened without you.

We worked hard on the goals we set back in September 2024.

Improving communication/cooperation:

- With families through weekly emails, monthly newsletters, our Facebook page and posters. Our meetings were on Zoom in response to the feedback we got from families, we also moved the time for 7pm later in the year.
- Communicating about issues beyond our school community, by sharing information from DPAC, inviting
 people to get familiar with the Proposed Budget, to voice their opinion, and attend public meetings.

Improving Safety:

- o School grounds: we had new signs installed, regarding restricting public access, dogs on leash and clean up.
- Traffic: PAC sent the letter to the School Board Trustees in June 2024. Our follow ups included emails and phone calls to the City of Burnaby Transportation department regarding traffic calming measures for the surrounding streets and intersections. While the City failed to communicate with us directly, they did come

on three different occasions to observe the traffic patterns, and they did communicate with Mr. Cornell about the planned measures.

Events & Activities:

We supported different activities, events and resources for our kids, such as:

- Field Trips for all divisions (worth over \$22,000)
- Pumpkin Patch & Halloween Parade
- Classroom Supplies & Resources for all divisions, as well as for music teachers, ELL and LSS teachers (\$5550)
- Recess Sports Equipment for all divisions (\$2250)
- Scholastic Book Fair and thanks to it books for the Library & Extra Resources for the Classrooms worth close to \$6,000
- Sports Day snacks for all the students
- Cookies for our Marlborough Carnaval
- o Ice cream Party for all the students who do extra including sports, choir, lunch and office monitors
- o School Garden
- Staff Appreciation events
- o Grade 7 Graduation Ceremony

Fundraising:

Given the ongoing budget issues and lack of overall funding for public schools, affecting the students' needs, it was one of our very important objectives to raise the funds for activities and resources. We worked hard to come up with fundraisers that families would be interested in. When deciding how to spend the money we wanted to be as inclusive as possible so most of our spending went towards the events and resources enjoyed by all, used by all. (listed above)

We had several seasonal fundraisers.

- Fall Term: Pumpkin Patch Donations, Neufeld Farms, Created by Kids Art Fundraiser, Purdy's Christmas Fundraiser, Family Photos Fundraiser and Scholastic Book Fair. We introduced FundScrip as an ongoing fundraiser, adding to Mabels Labels fundraiser
- o Winter Term: West Coast Seeds and Purdy's Easter Fundraiser
- Spring Term: Neufeld, Spring Plant Sale, Your Green Kitchen and Family Photo Fundraiser. We added COBS Bread as an ongoing, local fundraiser.

7. Treasurer's Report (Tanja in Patrick's absence)

Tanja presented the financial statement for the period ending May 9, 2025 (attached on the last page). Tanja presented two proposed amendments, one for moving the garden funds from PAC school account (\$802.23) to Garden school account. The funds are leftover form 2023/24 Grow our garden fundraiser. The other amendment was for Staff Appreciation budget to be increased by \$600. We had more staff members retiring which resulted in more spending.

8. CPF (Canadian Parents for French) Representative's Report

Mill T. was absent and there was no report to present.

9. Grade 7. Grad Committee Chair's Report (Cassandra V.)

The leaving ceremony and celebration is a month away. Everything is going as planned. The committee raised sufficient funds. Magic Show in April was sold out and went well. There are till some freezies sales planned and a sports day snack sale. The celebration is for 148 grade 7 students and 35-40 staff members. There are still some funds left from 2022/23 Grad 7 Committee. The plan is to host a Back-to-School Barbeque. PAC will be asked to join and have a table at the event.

10. 2025/2026 PAC Executive Committee Elections

All PAC Executive Members resigned as requested by the Constitution.

Mill Tsang nominated herself for CPF Position and was voted in.

Cassandra Vandusen and Yedian Cheng nominated themselves for Member-at-Large positions and were voted in.

In accordance with the PAC Constitution those PAC Executive members that can stay on will stay in their current positions until the next general meeting. *Election procedures: Section 10 (1) Elections (d) In the absence of a nomination for any office, the past officer will continue in the position until a nomination is received at any Marlborough PAC meeting. In the event that a past officer is unable or ineligible to fulfill their duties, the Executive Committee will decide on an alternative procedure.*

11. Questions & Answers

Q: Josie K. offered to create a survey that would explain to families about PAC, why it matters, and ask for input. She would like to do it in different languages. She would like to do it before the end of the school year, so that we can send it late summer, or early on in September. PAC Executive agreed and approved. Tanja added that PAC will have a table tomorrow for the "Welcome to Kindergarten" event in the East Gym. Tanja will share PAC key information with the new families during the presentation. Tanja and Cassandra will be at the table.

Q: Josie K. also suggested having a Health&Safety Representative on PAC Executive Team. Tanja clarified that while it's not in our Constitution as an Executive Role, we do have it as a committee so that interested parents could take part or take lead on the matter.

Q: Josie K. suggested having Class Representatives that would be working with PAC to share the information with their respective classes. PAC agreed with this idea. Tanaj mentioned that in some schools Class Representatives are required to attend PAC Executive Meetings. Given that that additional time commitment
